

Jack in the Beanstalk's Cousin





Although the Century plant resembles a giant aloe, it is in the agave family, and more related to the cactus than to the aloe. Typically, after about twenty to thirty years of life, the Century plant sends out a green stalk from the center of the plant. The name Century plant comes from a species found in the American desserts, *Agave Americana*, which blooms its first and only time when it reaches the advanced age of one hundred years.

Though they usually do not take 100 years to flower, Century plants may take many, many decades to bloom. The bloom stalk starts out as an asparagus looking spike, growing up from the rosette of cactus-like leaves, known as the mother plant. The stalk slowly grows putting out its flowers as it reaches upward.

The Agave Americana plants planted in Villas de Golf seem to be fairytale plants, more akin to Jack in the Beanstalk. Having been planted three years ago on the center island, and others planted earlier this year, it's fascinating that the environment at the Villas has accelerated the growth of the agaves by decades.

The belief is after a century, when the plant sprouts its' stalk, it then proceeds to die. Fortunately those planted 3 years ago have sprouted pups, smaller agaves growing around the base of the current plants. These are the next generation of a very special species of these heat tolerant plants. For the remaining Century Americana plants planted at Villas de Golf, we will have to watch and make the best of an unusual situation.

Amusing closing note: On the island of St. John, the main use of the Century plant stalk is for the traditional Christmas tree of the Virgin Islands. In December islanders search the bush for the mature Century plant. Ornaments are then hung from the branches; the end result is a colorful and less expensive alternative to the imported North American pine.
