2014 Rules and Regulations Annual Review

The annual review of the Villas de Golf Rules and Regulations has been completed. The 2014 Rules and Regulations pamphlet has been published and distributed. The BOD would like to draw your attention to the following two new Rules for 2014 as published on pages 6 and 11 of the pamphlet.

Non-Smoking: Smoking will NOT be permitted within the common areas such as the clubhouse, the pool hall, or maintenance building including the Association office. Smoking will also be prohibited within the fenced in area of the swimming pool as well as a reasonable distance (six feet or more) from any building on the condo grounds or tennis and/or shuffle board courts.

Semi-permanent patio furniture is restricted to outdoor style chairs in white, off-white, dark green, black, brown, or earth-tone blends that blend with the exterior colors of Villas de Golf. Chairs may be solid iron or plastic, or aluminum frame with sling seat, or equivalent. Tables are to compliment in color and type: round tables will not exceed 16 inches in diameter: square tables will not exceed 16 inches on any side. All patio furniture and materials must be removed from the patio when the unit is unoccupied.

If you have any questions or comments please contact any of the BOD members. Examples of the aluminum sling chairs can be viewed at the common gathering area behind building 9 and various other condo units behind buildings 4, 5, 8.

Although most of us stay aware and alert for scams, here is one more way that the scam artist tries to infiltrate your computer and more importantly access your money.

This scammer will call early in the morning, stating that he is a representative of Microsoft Windows Service Center. The caller states that your computer has experienced infiltration by a new virus that is currently infecting and corrupting your files. He sounds legitimate and will have the license number to your computer. He will lead you through some steps that appear dramatic, but are simply the records that your virus protection has archived. Finally he will take you to www.ammyy.com which is software that allows a remote software connection. DO NOT RUN this software.

AMMYY is legitimate software to allow remote desktop access. They have an official warning: If you receive a phone call claiming to be from "Microsoft" telling you that you have a virus or some errors which they will help you fix via Ammyy Admin, it is definitely a SCAM.

What to do...if you receive such a phone call DO NOT answer or simply hang up. If you become involved in the call NEVER allow them remote control access to your computer, NEVER provide credit card information or your password.

I had some prior knowledge of this scam and allowed them to walk me through the process until I needed to make a commitment; the caller (Los Angeles number with heavy South Asian accent) was furious that I would not proceed. Please DO NOT be fooled or intimidated.

SEW mark your calendar for WEDNESDAY afternoon and let's meet at the Clubhouse.


